

Ontario Welcomes over \$3 Million Manufacturing Investment

Sensor Technology Ltd. will create 11 new good-paying jobs in Collingwood

Collingwood, ON – The Ontario government is supporting an investment of \$3,333,333 by Sensor Technology Ltd. to boost local manufacturing and create 11 new good-paying jobs. Ontario is investing more than \$150 million through the <u>Regional Development Program</u> to strengthen the advanced manufacturing sector across the province and create new, good-paying jobs. The program

provides funding to businesses, municipalities and economic development organizations to help local communities attract investment, diversify their economies, and create jobs.

To date, Ontario has provided over \$150 million to support more than 110 projects through the program, leveraging over \$1.6 billion in new investments and helping to create more than 3,000 jobs.

"Our government is proud to support local manufacturers across the province as they grow and create more good-paying jobs in their communities," said Vic Fedeli, Minister of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade. "Investing in these types of community-building projects will help us continue to build Ontario and strengthen the economy. QUICK FACTS

- As part of the <u>2023 Ontario Budget</u>, the government is proposing a new Ontario Made
 Manufacturing Investment Tax Credit, which would provide a 10 per cent refundable Corporate
 Income Tax credit to help local manufacturers lower their costs, invest in workers, innovate and
 become more competitive.
- The government launched the <u>Regional Development Program</u> for Eastern and Southwestern Ontario in November 2019. Businesses and municipalities can get financial support through the Eastern Ontario Development Fund and Southwestern Ontario Development Fund and guided access to a range of complementary services and supports.
